In addition, you are required to become a member of I-ACT, the application and sponsorship will be completed during the training program.

I-ACT membership fee - \$150 -(included in \$2500.00 fee)

I-ACT certification testing fees - \$75 for each level exam (included in \$2500.00 fee)

**The I-ACT application will be emailed or mailed to you when you register for the class.
You must include two passport size photos with your application.**

Tuition includes:

- Manual for Level I.

- You will be getting and giving 25 colonics to fellow students & clients.
 - You will be training on the "Open & the closed system"
 - I-ACT membership
 - I-ACT Test Fee

On the last day of school, you will take the I-ACT Level I Test. Upon passing the Level I Test you will receive a certificate of completion. Your certification will come from the I-ACT office.

You should dress comfortably & take into consideration that you will be cleaning and doing other housekeeping such as cleaning toilets and general clean up. Please be considerate of others and do not wear scented fragrances.

We can only accommodate up to 5 students at a time so please book early.

I-ACT Foundation Level Requirements

In order to receive your certification for the foundation level from I-ACT you must:

Proof (by transcript) of completing a 100 hour course of Colon Hydrotherapy training from an I-ACT Registered School and/or an I-ACT Certified Instructor

Be a Full I-ACT Member in good standing.

Send your resume and proof of all related education; Seminars completed degrees and experience in both practice and theory. (Copies only)

Send pictures of your facility showing: waiting area, Colon Hydrotherapy room, bathroom, etc...

Send a blank copy of your Health Questionnaire. (Intake Form)

Carry Liability Insurance (if desired) and provide a copy of the policy front page (or a statement saying you do not wish to carry insurance).

Do a 15 minute presentation on colon hydrotherapy during class.

Pay for, take and pass an I-ACT Level 1 written exam.

Prior to embarking on your new career be sure to:

Be familiar with both the open and the closed systems.

Check with your state or city on the guidelines for licensing.

Check with your city in regard to the zoning for your new office.

Talk with other colon hydro therapists in your area to gather as much information as you can.
